LOWLINC Speaker Series. Travis H. Stoner, Doctor of Physical Therapy, *PT: A Critical Component of Your Overall Well-Being*. Wednesday, May 9. 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Community Center.



When you think of physical therapy, what probably comes to mind is a limited-term stint with a PT professional for help recovering from an injury, surgical procedure or temporary condition. An equally important part of physical therapy focuses on treatments for chronic, longer-term conditions such as mobility impairments caused by diseases like Parkinson's, and problems of balance like vertigo and dizziness... conditions that can appear and affect us as we age.

Dr. Travis Stoner of Fusion Physical Therapy will speak about these issues, including how communication happens between you, your physical therapist and other health care providers, and current research on exercise as we age. Dr. Stoner graduated from Shenandoah University with a Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology in 2002 and a Doctor of Physical Therapy in 2005. He has experience in a variety of physical therapy areas, including neurological, vestibular (balance), total joint replacement rehabilitation and aquatic physical therapy.

New Medicare Cards Being Mailed Soon. If you are a Medicare enrollee, you will soon be receiving a new card that no longer contains your social security number. For security reasons, the SSN is being replaced by a new unique identifier that is a combination of letters and numbers. Make sure Medicare has your current address, and otherwise you don't need to do anything to receive your new card. Be aware that the scammers are already working to defraud you with phone calls, emails and demands for money. **Dispose of Your Expired Prescriptions.** A number of businesses and agencies in our area will be collecting your unused and out-of-date prescriptions on Saturday, April 28 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The closest one to Lake of the Woods is the Spotsylvania Company 5 Fire Station on Route 3. LOWLINC volunteers will take your prescriptions for you to be destroyed (they are incinerated). Call 1-855-LOWLINC (569-5462) to arrange.
