Many members have expressed an interest in genealogy, and we have engaged Katie Derby, a professional genealogist who is currently a reference librarian with the Culpeper County Library. Those of us who have heard Katie present know that attendees are in for a real treat...she's knowledgeable, personable and makes her subject fun and understandable. Katie's talk will be: **The Price is Right: Free Online Research.** This presentation is great for both seasoned Internet surfers and for beginner surfers.

Basic Calligraphy - The Foundational Hand. Tuesday, April 23, 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. Community Center. \$5 fee for supplies.



Presented by LOWLINC volunteer, Marilyn Davis, who will teach the basics of calligraphy: what it is, tools to use, and how to get started. She will go over basic calligraphic strokes that make up the Foundational hand...also the starting point for learning other hands like Italic.

All you need for this class are (if you have them) some pencils, an

eraser, a ruler, and most importantly, your enthusiasm and willingness to learn something new. Good handwriting is not a prerequisite for calligraphy! Participants will leave with a handmade bookmark and an appreciation for the calligraphic arts.
